THE SUMMIT SAFE PARKING PROGRAM

Providing a safe place to park for those whose home is their vehicle.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: Summit Safe Parking Program

- Successfully operated three years with no law enforcement issues
- Interacted with somewhere over 50 individuals
- Began at Agape Church July 2019, moved to Justice Center in Breckenridge April, 2022
- Members comment: Provides security, relieves anxiety, allows focus on job, health, and saving money
- To apply: on-line application/questionnaire (see attached)
 - Provide driver's license, insurance, registration, vehicle identity, proof of employment
 - Interview with an intake volunteer
 - Sign a community agreement effective in regulating and Waiver and Release of Liability (attached)
 - Receive a windshield permit when accepted (attached)
- Unsheltered Committee provides trash collection and a porta potty paid for by a small monthly fee plus monitoring of health/emotional needs if needed.

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THE REQUEST:

Unsheltered is seeking 10-15 year-round parking spots total, with some spaces allowing members who work late at night to be able to stay asleep later in the morning past what we offer in Breckenridge, which is 8:00 a.m. While Unsheltered has identified several possible places we feel could be suitable for Safe Overnight Parking within the Frisco area, (see below) we are also open to suggestions from the Frisco Town Council and Staff. We see these areas from the standpoint of how they would work for our members but are not privy to information regarding how those areas are used by the general population.

Criteria which make a lot optimal for members are: level ground, low light, relative quiet, and somewhat secluded.

Areas of possible use:

1. Paved lots in the peninsula area (see attached)
2. Paved lot(s) east of I70/south of Mainstreet referred to as the Kayak lot(s)
3. The Dickey Day Use trailhead lot.
4. The Lower side of the County Commons
5. Giberson Bay Day Use lot

A suggestion has been made that more than one lot could be permitted so that when a certain area is in demand for other activities, Safe Parking members would know that they could go to an alternate lot at that time.

The Rules of Community Respect: (Please initial each indicating that you agree to uphold)

- ___ Respect and respond to your Unsheltered Point of Entry Person and your lot hosts.
- ___ Observe the hours for the lot location. (Lots are currently available 6:00 p.m. - 8:00 a.m.)
- ___ Members are expected to remain in the designated lot
- ___ Pets are expected to be leashed at all times, have valid Pet Licenses issued by Summit County, and to have their waste disposed of properly.
- ___ No campfires or outdoor cooking are allowed.
- ___ No "set-up" is allowed. Keep all personal items inside your vehicle.
- ___ Your vehicle is your home and the space around it is your community, so keep trash, cigarette butts, etc. picked up, grounds clean and well maintained.
- ___ If you turn your vehicle engine on to keep warm, stay awake to turn it off.
- ___ During the winter season snow plowing will be provided for the main lot, but the area around your vehicle may need to be maintained by you. If needed, members should be prepared to move their vehicles to accommodate snow plowing. Occasionally, patience is needed until the service provider can get to the lot.
- ___ Noise level must be acceptable and respectful to the vehicles next to you. Keep music/noise range to a few feet from your own vehicle. Also be mindful of your lights so as not to disturb others.
- ___ The Parking Lot property is a drug free zone. No alcohol or illegal drugs may be consumed on the lot.
- ___ No firearm of any type may be brought onto the property.
- ___ In the case of an infraction of this agreement or a complaint from the property owner, Unsheltered or other community members, the situation will be taken to a panel of Unsheltered Committee members for review and possible loss of permit with a reply being given in no more than three days.
- ___ Fighting or infractions of Summit County/Colorado Law, including trespassing onto adjacent private property, will be cause to revoke your permit immediately.
- ___ Be prepared to renew your permit every 6 months.

Waiver and Release of Liability

1. The undersigned will be participating in the Summit Safe Parking Program (“Program”).
2. The undersigned has read the description of the Program and acknowledges and understands the risks associated with this activity.

In consideration of being allowed to participate in the Program and receive the benefits of the Program, the undersigned hereby, for himself/herself, his/her heirs, executors, administrators, assigns and personal representatives, knowingly and voluntarily discharges, waives, releases, acquits, defends, indemnifies and holds harmless the undersigned listed individuals or entities and their respective successors, administrators, representatives, agents, officials, staff members, employees, officers, attorneys, and their respective successors and assigns (collectively, the “Releasees”), from any and all claims, demands, damages, actions, causes of action, or suits of any kind or nature whatsoever, which may arise out of or result out of the undersigned’s participation in the Program.
4. The undersigned acknowledges that he/she has is waiving any right that he/she may otherwise have to bring a legal action for personal injury or property damage.
5. In the event that any provision contained within this Waiver and Release shall be deemed to be unenforceable, the remainder of this Waiver and Release shall remain in full force and effect.
