STRATEGIC PLAN

Priority: Economy

- ▶ Fiber Infrastructure – Planning / Design, Town owned infrastructure, Granite Street conduit (Dig Once)
- ▶ Destination Management Plan / Peak Day Management Plan – October 25 Town Council agenda, Contingency Planning (not currently in the budget)
- ▶ Survey: Workforce Shortage & Business Resources (not currently in the budget)



STRATEGIC PLAN

Priority: Environment

- ▶ Elimination of single-use plastics
- ▶ Water Bottle Filling Stations (not currently in budget)
- ▶ Implement Climate Action Plan – replace vehicles with EV & Hybrid, EV training & tools, Public Works solar panels, solar analysis on other Town-owned buildings
- ▶ Transportation Alternatives – Mobility Master Plan included in budget



STRATEGIC PLAN

Priority: Recreation, Arts, & Culture

- ▶ Neighborhood Parks Plan – Old Town Hall Park; basketball court (not currently in 2023 budget – could be included in 2024 park plan)
- ▶ Trails Master Plan – Highway 9 sidewalks, Miner's Creek recreation path bridge
- ▶ Strategic Arts Plan

Priority: Core Services

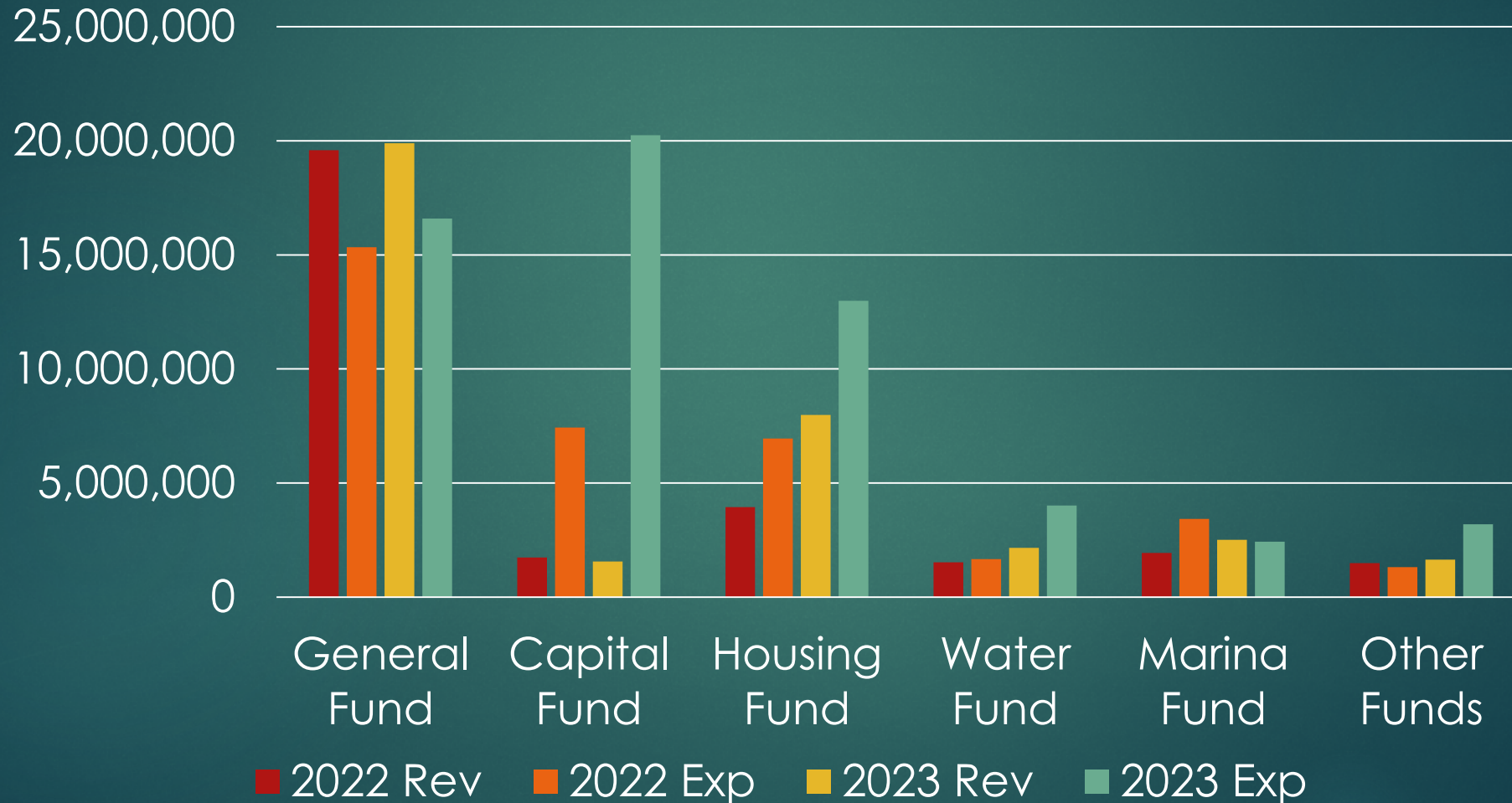
- ▶ 90% Staffing – Employer of Choice: enhance total compensation, culture, and equipment

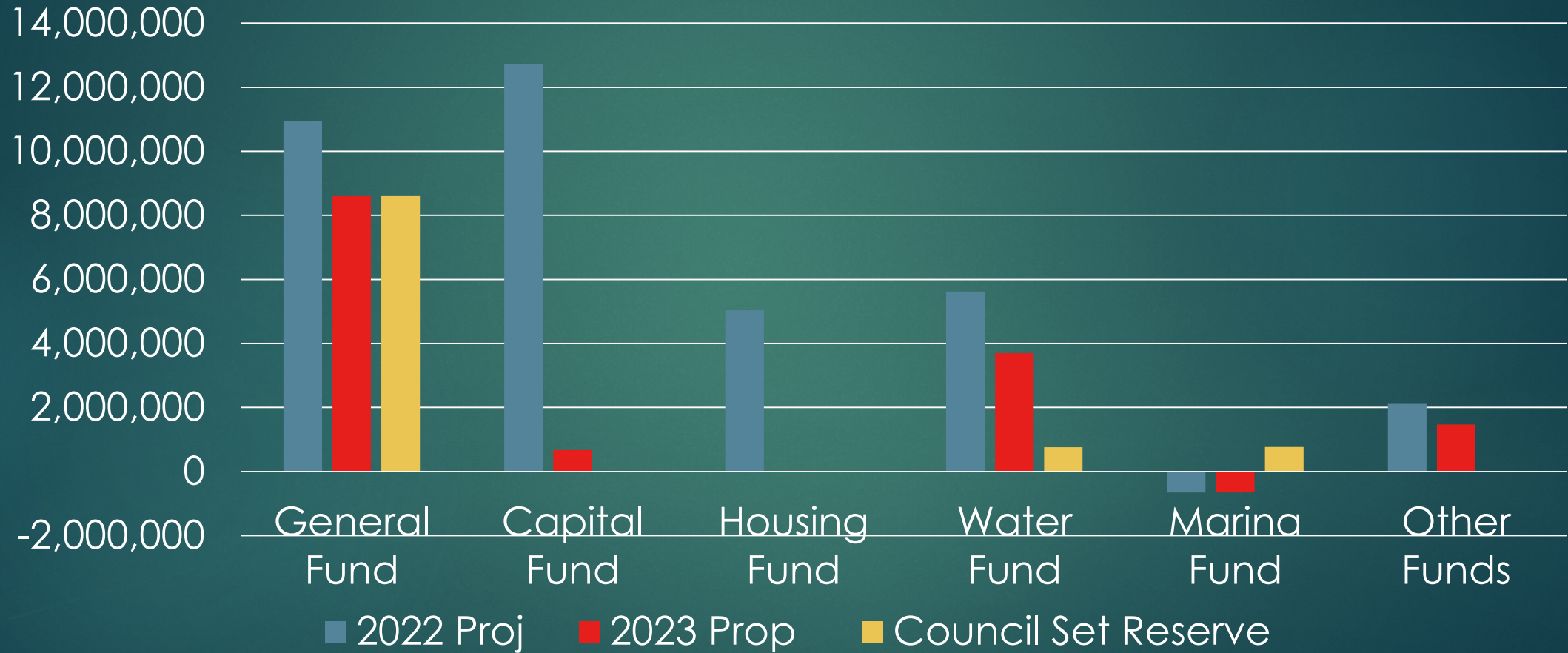

2022 vs 2023

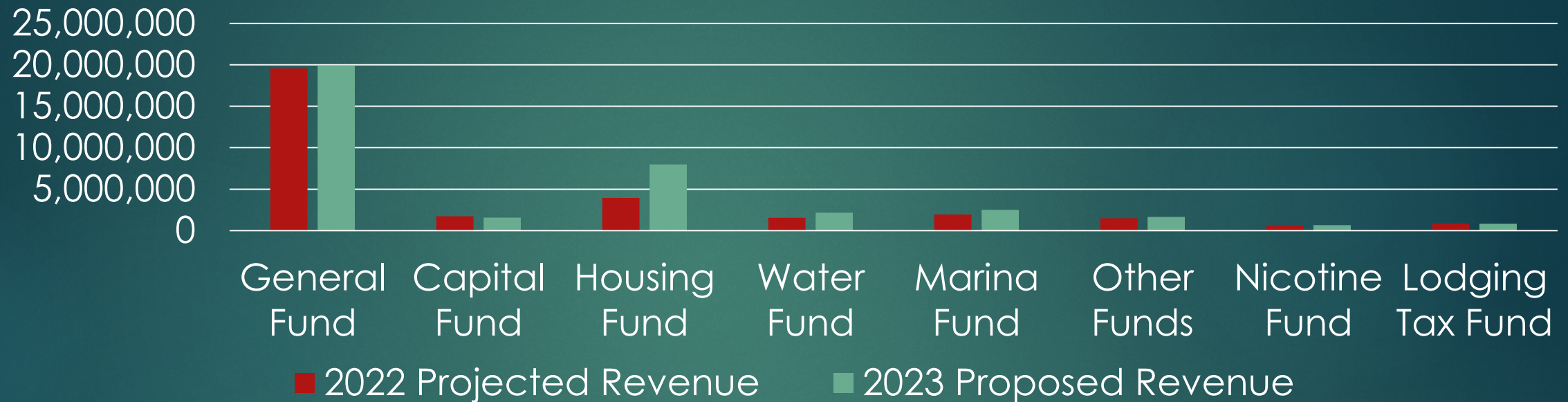


PROPOSED BUDGET

REVENUE FORECAST



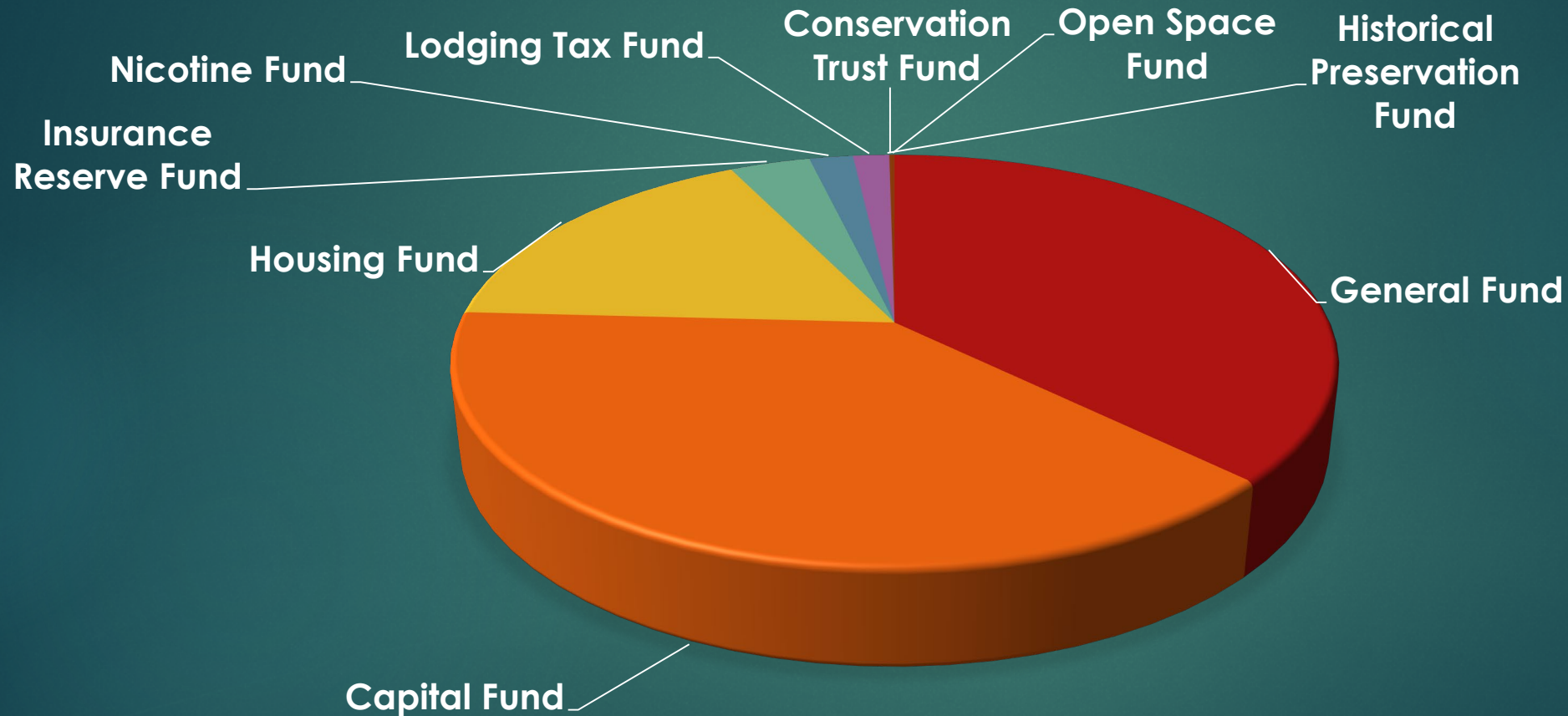

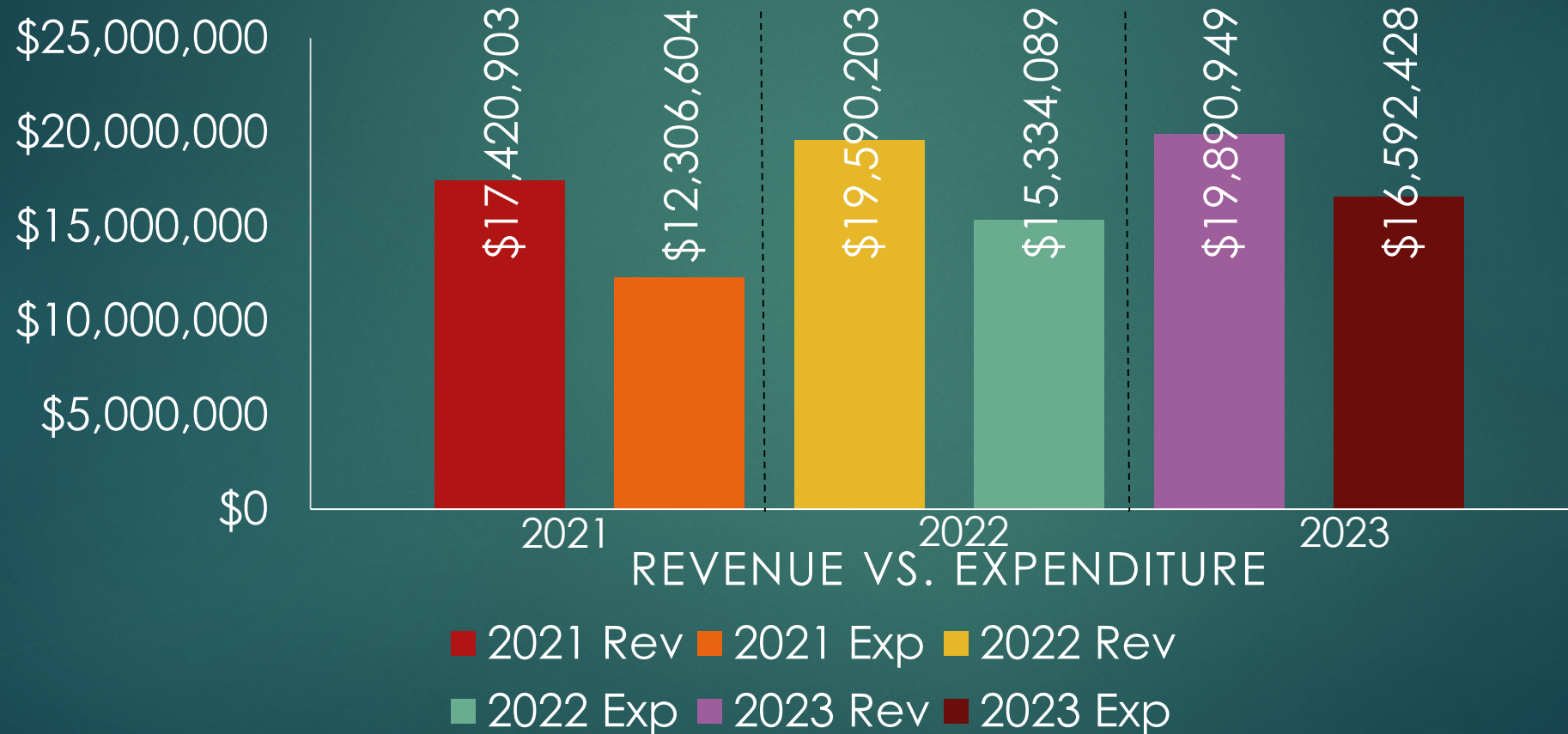

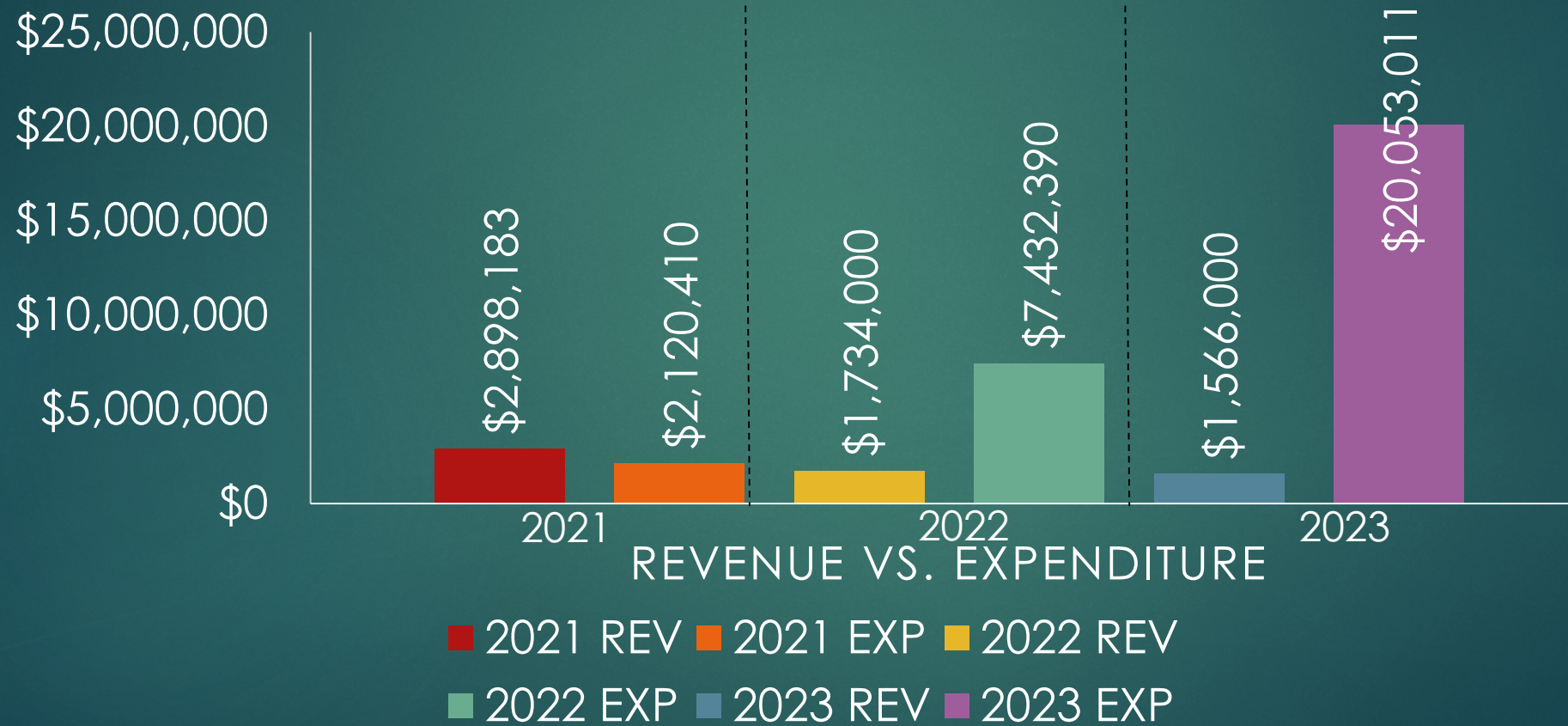

GENERAL FUND HIGHLIGHTS

- ▶ **Employee Compensation** to stay competitive in the market – up to 5% merit increase and additional allowance for wage inflation
- ▶ **\$61,510 Employee Benefits** – increasing H.S.A, adding HealthJoy, Tuition Reimbursement, & Biometric Testing to remain Employer of Choice
- ▶ **-\$1.9M Utilizing Insurance Reserve Fund**
- ▶ **\$25,000 Frisco Locals housing program** for Town Staff
- ▶ **-\$250,000 Moved Childcare Tuition Assistance Program** to Nicotine Fund
- ▶ **\$38,000 Afterschool Care** through Recreation Department
- ▶ **\$25,000** increase to **Non-profit Grant funding**
- ▶ **\$40,000 Pay-As-You-Throw** implementation grants
- ▶ **\$187,850** additional **Police staffing**
- ▶ **\$200,000 Bridge infrastructure repair & maintenance**
- ▶ **\$25,000 Electric Vehicle training & tools**

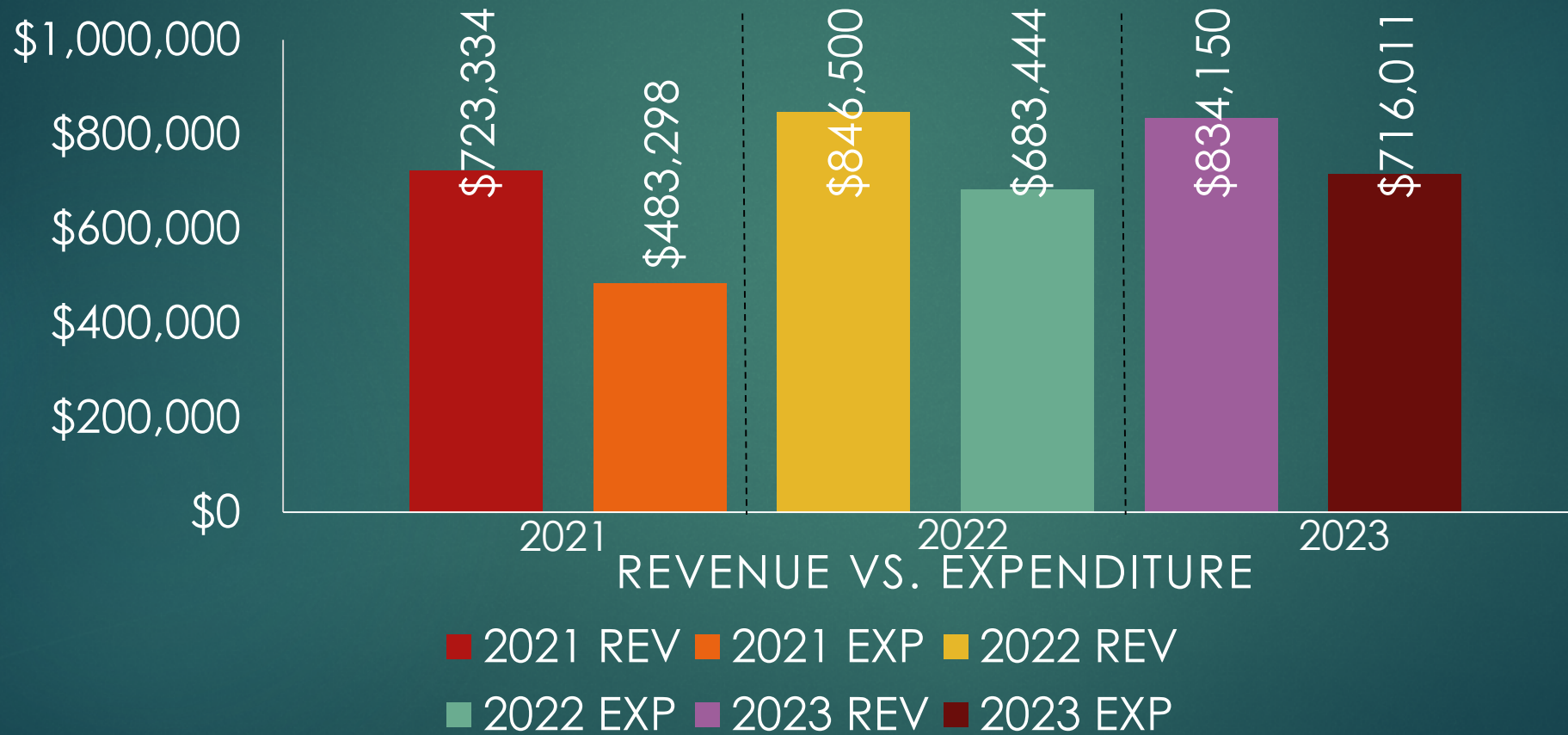

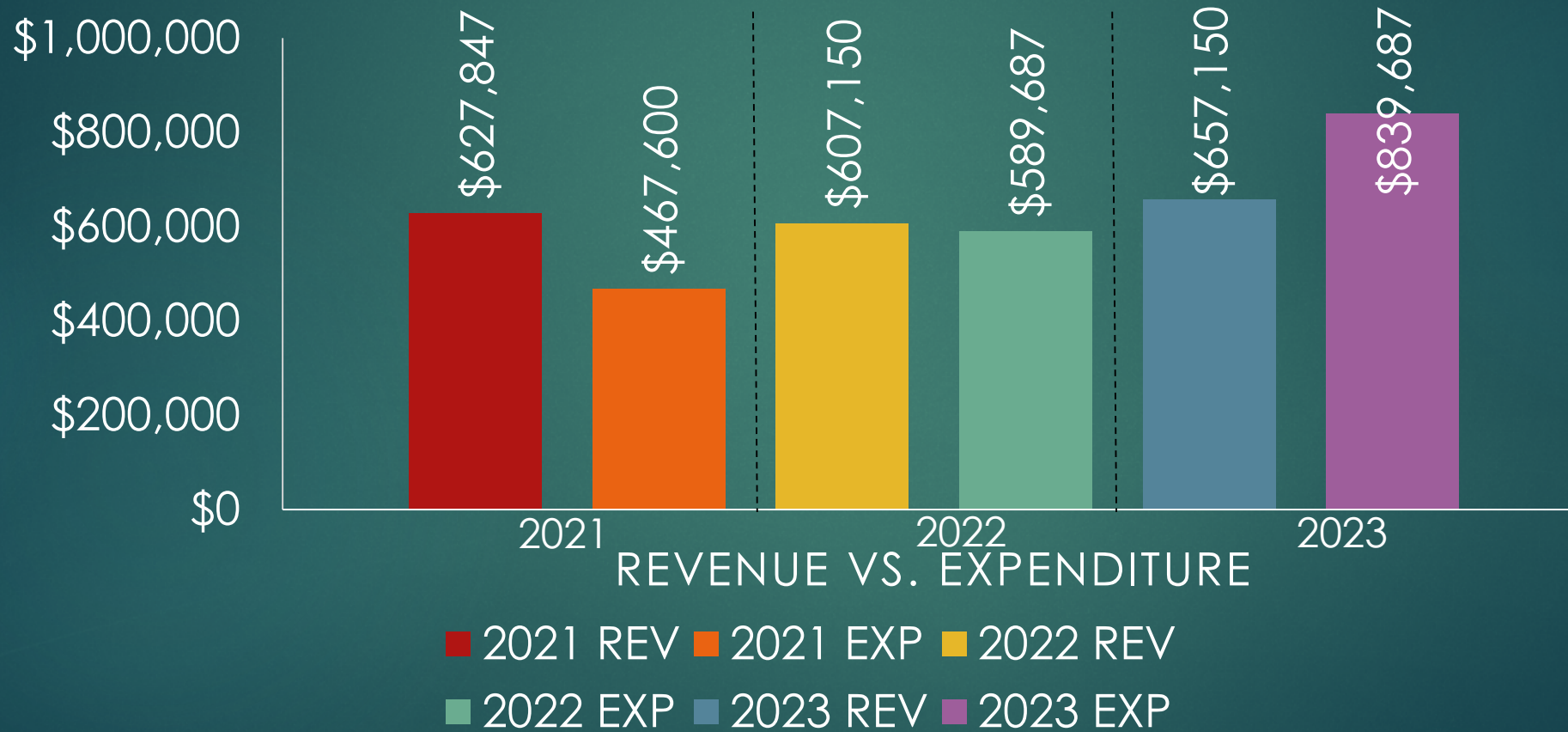
