Summary and Background: Please find attached the ordinance setting the mill levy within the Town of Frisco for property tax assessed in 2022, to be collected in 2023. The 0.798 proposed mill levy is the amount the Town is authorized to impose and cannot be increased without an election. Property Tax collections are utilized for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the General Fund. The ordinance is submitted for first reading.

<u>Financial Impact</u>: For the 2023 budget year, based upon preliminary figures from the Summit County Assessor, Staff is forecasting the 0.798 mill levy to result in property tax revenues of \$205,574.

<u>Alignment with Strategic Plan:</u> The 0.798 mills are for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the General Fund and supports all strategic priorities of the Town of Frisco.

<u>Staff Recommendation</u>: Staff recommends that Town Council approve Ordinance 22-13 to levy property tax, as related to the 2023 budget.
