## TOWN OF FRISCO COUNTY OF SUMMIT STATE OF COLORADO RESOLUTION 20-31

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF FRISCO, COLORADO, REESTABLISHING AN ECONOMIC RELIEF PROGRAM FOR BUSINESSES, DIRECTING THE IMMEDIATE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROGRAM IN RESPONSE TO THE COVID-19 PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY, AND AUTHORIZING THE EXPENDITURE OF FUNDS FOR THE PROGRAM

WHEREAS, on March 10, 2020, the Governor of the State of Colorado declared a statewide state of emergency in response to coronavirus (COVID-19); and

WHEREAS, on March 14, 2020, the President of the United States declared a national emergency in response to the coronavirus (COVID-19); and

WHEREAS, the World Health Organization has declared the coronavirus (COVID-19) to be a worldwide pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the coronavirus (COVID-19) has been confirmed to exist in Summit County; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council is empowered by Section 31-15-401(1)(b), C.R.S., to do all acts and make all regulations which may be necessary or expedient for the promotion of health or the suppression of disease; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council finds that the public health regulations that have been necessary to fight the COVID-19 pandemic have caused the sudden cessation, or near cessation, of most business activities within the Town to the great hardship of many residents, business owners and individuals employed within Frisco; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution 20-11, the Town previously adopted and has implemented economic relief programs for businesses and individuals; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council finds and determines that the adoption of this Resolution is necessary to provide additional aid to businesses within the Town in dealing with the continuing extreme economic impacts that have resulted from the public health regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council further finds and determines that the adoption of this ordinance is proper under Section 31-15-401(1)(b), C.R.S., and other applicable law.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED AND ORDERED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF FRISCO, COLORADO THAT:

<u>Section 1.</u> <u>Business Assistance Program.</u> There is hereby reestablished a Business Assistance Program (BAP) to provide grants in aid of Frisco businesses that have had their operations severely limited by public health orders related to the COVID-19

pandemic. Unless there is further action	of the Town Council, the program shall
distribute not more than	Thousand Dollars (\$,000) in total
grants, and no grant to any single business s	hall exceed the amount set forth in Table A
below:

To be eligible to receive a grant under the Business Assistance Program, the business must:

- have had its operations severely limited by having been prohibited in sales or service to the public, or prohibited or severely limited from onsite consumption of foods or beverages, by one or more of the public health orders issued in connection with COVID-19:
- 2. have a current, valid Town business license issued on or before March 1, 2020;
- 3. still be in operation as of the date of the grant award;
- 4. be the owner of a physical business located within the Town of Frisco jurisdictional boundaries. Virtual and remotely operating businesses excluded;
- 5. not be a publicly traded corporation, nor be owned by, controlled by, or a subsidiary of a publicly traded corporation, nor be an entity that has more than Two and a Half Million Dollars (\$2,500,000) in annual gross revenues, nor be owned by, controlled by, or a subsidiary of any such entity;
- 6. be able to demonstrate a decline in gross sales or revenue between January 1, 2020 to November 30, 2020 as compared to January 1, 2019 to November 30, 2019 as certified and approved by the Town of Frisco through reported gross sales receipts, or a Town-approved affidavit affirming gross revenues.

Section 2. Business Innovation Grant P	<u>rogram</u> . There is hereby established a
business innovation grant program to prov	vide grants in aid of Frisco businesses that
have implemented innovative or adaptive	strategies modifying business operations to
meet the crisis. Unless there is further act	tion of the Town Council, the program shall
distribute not more than	Thousand Dollars (\$,000) in total
grants, and no grant to any single busi	ness shall exceed Five Thousand Dollars
(\$5,000.00) per business. To be eligible	e to receive a grant under the Business
Innovation Grant Program, the business mu	

- 1. have a current, valid Town business license issued on or before March 1, 2020;
- 2. still be in operation as of the date of the grant award;
- 3. not be a publicly traded corporation, nor be owned by, controlled by, or a subsidiary of a publicly traded corporation, nor be an entity that has more than Two and a Half Million Dollars (\$2,500,000) in annual gross revenues, nor be owned by, controlled by, or a subsidiary of any such entity;
- 4. be able to demonstrate expenses incurred for innovative and adaptive measures implementing structural or technical improvements (e.g.: outdoor dining structures, improved air filtration systems, new/improved no-touch features for customers, and improved technology modifying business operations to meet public health constraints, etc.).

<u>Section 3.</u> <u>Town Manager to Implement Program</u>. The Town Manager is hereby authorized and directed to take all actions reasonably necessary or desirable to immediately implement the business assistance programs reestablished herein.
